

AVMA Political Action Committee (AVMA PAC)

Advocating for the profession is central to the AVMA's mission, and the AVMA PAC is an important advocacy tool that helps amplify our voice with members of Congress. The AVMA PAC is nonpartisan; we contribute to those in Congress who support the issues important to veterinary medicine regardless of political party affiliation. AVMA PAC support helps to elect officials to Congress who are dedicated to improving animal health and welfare, public health, and the veterinary medical profession. In accordance with adopted guidelines, the AVMA PAC contributes to the political campaigns of members of Congress who support the AVMA legislative agenda or are in key positions where it is advantageous to the AVMA legislative agenda for them to hear and consider the AVMA's position in their decision-making process. To provide the necessary funds, the AVMA PAC solicits personal contributions from AVMA members, their immediate families, Student American Veterinary Medical Association (SAVMA) members, and select AVMA employees.

Contributing to AVMA PAC is often the first step in becoming politically active, and members who contribute to the AVMA PAC are more likely to vote in elections and get involved in political campaigns. Support for the AVMA PAC has benefited the Association and the entire veterinary profession by allowing our Government Relations Division (GRD) staff and AVMA members to build and foster important personal relationships.

The AVMA PAC Board oversees the business of the AVMA PAC and operates in accordance with Federal Election Committee rules and regulations, in addition to the AVMA PAC Policies and Procedures. The AVMA PAC Board consists of seven members—three at-large members are appointed by the AVMA Board of Directors, and three regional members (East, Central, West) are appointed by the AVMA House Advisory Committee. SAVMA appoints the student liaison.

Meetings

The AVMA PAC Board conducts business via in-person meetings, virtual meetings, and electronic votes. In 2022, the PAC Board continued to hold a mix of in-person and virtual meetings. The board held in-person meeting in Washington, DC on May 2 and 3, 2022 and again at the 2022 AVMA Convention in Philadelphia on July 30. The board held a long-format virtual meeting on November 15, and shorter virtual meetings took place on January 25, and September 12.

AVMA PAC Operations

The AVMA provides the AVMA PAC operational budget, which allows AVMA PAC to utilize 100% of all AVMA and SAVMA member contributions for political campaigns. Expenses for 2022 were \$128,481. Since 2017, the AVMA PAC has worked with DDC Public Affairs, a Washington, DC based organization that has over 300 PAC clients. DDC provides FEC compliance services, account reconciliation, database management, and contribution management, including processing AVMA PAC contribution checks.

Fundraising

AVMA PAC Fundraising 2022

For 2022, the AVMA PAC Board set an aggressive goal of raising \$400,000 from 2800 contributors, which were 7% and 8% higher than 2021's goals, respectively. The PAC raised \$322,038 from 1,986 contributors. This is a 5% increase in contributions over 2021. In 2022, 100% of the Board of Directors and 83% of the PAC eligible House of Delegates members contributed to AVMA PAC.

In 2022, the AVMA PAC made a full return to in-person fundraising at several events throughout the year. At the 2022 Veterinary Leadership Conference/House of Delegates Regular Winter Session, a total of \$51,180 was raised from 69 individuals, a large increase over the 2021 virtual meeting, but still below the 2020 total of over \$70,000. The PAC Board held a reception for all AVMA members present at VLC and the HOD session which included an address from PAC Board chair Dr. Bridget Heilsberg.

The AVMA PAC continued to focus on connecting directly with more AVMA members in leadership positions on AVMA Councils and Committees, state and allied associations, and other groups such as deans, faculty, and rising leaders. In 2022, AVMA PAC Board members continued to address and solicit several AVMA Councils and Committees during virtual meetings.

The AVMA PAC returned to the 2022 SAVMA Symposium in March, held in-person for the first time since 2019 in Minneapolis by the University of Minnesota CVM. The PAC representatives took an educational approach over direct fundraising by hosting the SAVMA Government Affairs Committee (GAC) at the booth, helping distribute the

new GAC Advocacy toolkit, and holding “Know Your District” sweepstakes. Over 100 students took part in the sweepstakes, the most engagement for any student initiative with the PAC in several years.

AVMA PAC returned to in-person fundraising activities at the 2022 AVMA Convention in Philadelphia. The PAC hosted a reception for AVMA Delegates and Board members early in the week and awarded the Russell Anthony ImPACt award for the first time since 2020. The winner, Dr. Fred Gingrich, was chosen for his long-time personal contributions to AVMA PAC, and his ability to act as a PAC Diplomat among AABP and other members of the profession. The PAC returned to holding a pre-concert Happy Hour on the Sunday evening of Convention, which welcomed over 90 members and guests at a brewery near the AVMA Concert venue. The PAC raised a total of \$64,350 at the 2022 Convention from 137 contributors.

The AVMA PAC expanded its attendance at regional and allied meetings in the fall of 2022. AVMA PAC staff and board members attended the Southwestern Veterinary Symposium (SWVS), the American Association of Bovine Practitioners (AABP) Annual Meeting, the New England Veterinary Conference, and the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) Annual Convention.

In the fall of 2022, AVMA PAC expanded its direct mail and email campaign to reach over 27,000 AVMA members, an increase of over 5,000 members from 2021. This included “lapsed” donors, who had contributed to AVMA PAC since 2000, but not yet in 2022. Recipients included lapsed donors, recent graduates, Honor Roll members, and practice owners. The campaign included a mail piece with a QR code for members to scan and contribute, then an email follow-up with another link to contribute. The content of both focused on AVMA PAC’s successes in aiding AVMA’s advocacy efforts during COVID-19, defeating mandatory prescription writing legislation, and securing funding for important federal programs.

AVMA PAC Fundraising 2023

The AVMA PAC Board continued to raise its fundraising expectations and set a goal of \$425,000 from 2800 contributors for 2023. At the 2023 Veterinary Leadership Conference/House of Delegates Regular Winter Session, AVMA PAC met its goal of raising just over \$60,000 – an increase of over \$10,000 compared to 2022.

The PAC kicked off the 2023 AVMA PAC Alumni Derby competition at VLC by hosting a special Alumni Derby Cocktail bar at an all-member reception. The derby will run until July 16 at the AVMA Convention in Denver and contributions during this period are counted towards the alumni participation rate for the contributor's veterinary school. At the end of the contest, the top 3 schools will be awarded grants to their SAVMA Chapters in the amounts of \$3,000, \$2,000, and \$1,000, respectively. The Alumni Derby has been the focus of most AVMA PAC outreach during the first half of 2023. This has included mentions in AVMA updates to councils and committees, highlights in AVMA Vitals emails, outreach to SAVMA chapters in newsletters and at the 2023 SAVMA symposium, and in a mailer sent to approximately 25,000 AVMA members in June of 2023.

The AVMA PAC continued to expand its meeting presence in 2023. In February, AVMA PAC staff and board members attended the Midwestern Veterinary Conference in Columbus, Ohio. In March, members of the AVMA PAC board and AVMA GRD staff attended the 2023 SAVMA Symposium in Champaign, Illinois. The PAC maintained a goal to keep its SAVMA presence as educational to expose students to the importance of AVMA PAC and advocacy in general. In April, the AVMA PAC hosted a reception for attendees of the 2023 AVMA legislative fly-in in Washington, DC. The event was meant to educate attendees about the importance of the PAC and promote the Alumni Derby.

Between January 1, 2023-June 1, 2023, AVMA PAC raised over \$119,000 from 407 contributors compared to \$100,445 and 437 during the same period in 2022. This represents a 19% increase in receipts in 2023 to-date. As of June 1, 2023, AVMA PAC has over \$103,000 in funds available for new contributions.

AVMA PAC has several events planned for the 2023 AVMA Convention and summer House of Delegates (HOD) meeting. At the HOD meeting, AVMA PAC will award the Russell Anthony ImPACt award and host a reception for all HOD and Board of Directors members. During the AVMA Convention, AVMA PAC will join the rest of the AVMA family in the AVMA pavilion, and will host a pre-concert happy hour on Sunday, July 16. The winners for the 2023 Alumni Derby will be announced at this event, and PAC staff has engaged AVMA Convention staff to grow the scope of the event and drive more attendance.

Later in 2023, the AVMA PAC is scheduled to attend the Southwestern Veterinary Symposium, the American Association of Bovine Practitioners Annual Meeting, the New England Veterinary Conference, and the American

Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) Annual Convention. In addition, the PAC will expand upon its fall direct mail and email campaign to reach a larger number of AVMA members, draft a new “advertorial” for a JAVMA issue, and start direct outreach to a new database of donors with larger contribution capacity.

AVMA Ambassador Program

The AVMA Ambassador Program was launched in January 2018 and is intended to protect and promote veterinary medicine by leveraging AVMA PAC to use local voices to amplify AVMA’s legislative priorities with targeted members of Congress.

Working closely with state and allied veterinary medical associations as well as AVMA leadership, a reliable cadre of effective veterinary leaders, communicators and advocates are identified. Ambassadors attend political events or have one-on-one meetings with key lawmakers while they are in their respective states and/or districts. While meeting with their lawmakers, Ambassadors advocate for the profession by advancing AVMA’s legislative agenda. They also nurture relationships with lawmakers and their staff. AVMA’s goal is for the Ambassadors to become reliable “go to” experts for their members of Congress on matters related to veterinary medicine, animal health and welfare. In 2022, 21 Ambassadors held 23 events with 28 lawmakers in 17 states. So far in 2023, 8 Ambassadors held 8 events with 16 lawmakers in 8 states.

AVMA PAC Contributions to Qualified Candidates

The AVMA PAC uses the following criteria in evaluating distributions:

- Is the incumbent/candidate or his/her family member a veterinarian?
- Is the incumbent/candidate a pro-science and pro-veterinary medicine legislator?
- Does the incumbent/candidate represent a district/state with veterinary schools?
- Does the incumbent/candidate represent a district/state with a significant number of AVMA members, and does the incumbent/candidate have a strong relationship with AVMA members?
- Does the incumbent sit on key Congressional committees which consider legislation important to AVMA and support AVMA positions?

AVMA PAC guidelines:

- AVMA PAC supports congressional members who are veterinarians or have a veterinarian in their family.
- AVMA PAC supports incumbents who serve in leadership positions or are on key congressional committees that consider legislation important to AVMA and who are supportive of AVMA policies and positions.
- AVMA PAC supports incumbents who understand veterinary concerns and are supportive of AVMA positions.
- AVMA PAC's priority is to Members of Congress who serve in leadership or who sit on committees of jurisdiction, such as the: House and Senate Agriculture Committees; House Energy and Commerce Committee; Senate HELP committee; House Small Business Committee; and Senate Small Business and Entrepreneurship Committee.
- AVMA PAC will not generally contribute to a Leadership PAC. In special circumstances, Leadership PACs will be considered.
- AVMA PAC will not generally contribute to a Senate race out of cycle. In special circumstances, such races will be considered.
- AVMA PAC will not generally contribute to the retirement of campaign debt. In special circumstances, debt retirement will be considered.
- AVMA PAC will comply with the letter and spirit of all federal and state laws.

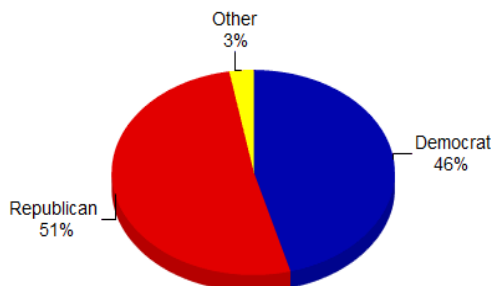

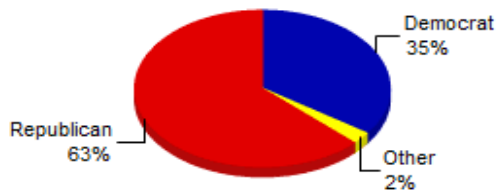
117th Congressional Cycle Contributions (2021-2022)

In 2022 alone, AVMA PAC made 178 candidate contributions for a total of \$352,500. AVMA PAC made a total of \$544,500 in the 2021-22 election cycle. This represents a 42% increase over the 2019-2020 election cycle.
